3. NEW BUSINESS - CURRICULUM APPROVAL

3.1. School of Life Science & Business

- 3.1.1. New Course BUS 2230 Business Law, Ethics, and Corporate Social Responsibility (D.Bullock)
 - This is a new course.
 - Upon multiple discussions with industry members, there was a trend that became
 apparent that graduates lack an understanding of laws and ethics within the workplace.
 Understanding these principles helps students make ethical decisions and comply with
 laws in their future careers. It also prepares them to be responsible and ethical leaders in
 the business world.
 - Additionally, with the influx of international students who may not be familiar with Canadian business laws and ethical cultural norms, it is an important time to consider adding this course.

3.1.2. BUS 2220 - Research and Data Management (D.Bullock)

- The course description has been revised to indicate the student opportunity for a work integrated learning project, which is already occurring.
- Adding in some additional written communication for research pieces to enhance the student learning.
- This course and the BUS 2000 Business Statistics course are corequisites to the BUSDIP Business Management.

3.1.3. COM 2250 - Strategic Communications (D.Bullock)

 It is proposed to make this course inactive as of summer 2025 and to bring on new courses for the business diploma. The essential skills of this course are still taught in BUS 2220 Research and Data Management course.

3.1.4. MGT 2120 - Risk Management (D.Bullock)

- It is proposed to make the Risk Management course inactive as of Summer 2025 when the
 new courses for the business diploma program come on board. The concepts of risk
 management are covered in other courses in the Business diploma. Students indicated
 there was too much overlap in this area.
- The principles of risk management are covered in MGT2100 management principles.
 Marketing analysis and pricing strategies are covered in marketing. The legal aspects of business will be covered in the new law class as well as insurance. There will no longer be an in depth risk management plan project completed with the removal of this course.

• The PCC deemed this course far more in depth than what was needed for a business diploma and prioritized other skills as being more relevant for this level of credential.

3.1.5. MGT 2240 - Innovation and Strategy (D.Bullock)

 The Risk Management course was removed from the diploma program so we also updated the prerequisites for the course.

3.1.6. <u>BUSIDIP - Business Management - General Management Major (D.Bullock)</u>

- The proposed changes are aimed at enhancing program relevance aligning with industry needs and addressing feedback from students regarding the content covered in the second year. The existing curriculum was originally created on a framework that included an integrated project between classes. Since this framework is no longer used it brings an opportunity to adjust the second year of the program and ensure it is in line with student preferences and industry needs.
- NOTE: Changes to the diploma are only for the second year of the program. No changes
 are recommended for the first year (this is the Business Management Certificate).
- Proposed changes:
 - Removal of courses: MGT2120-Risk Management and COM2250-Strategic
 Communications courses will be removed from the curriculum.
 - Addition of new courses: Introduction of 2 new courses. A version of both of these were offered before the integrated learning model. The 2 courses would be Business Law, Ethics, and Corporate Social Responsibility; and Statistics.

3.2. Werklund School of Agriculture Technology

3.2.1. DGTLAGR - Bachelor of Digital Agriculture (J. Steeves)

- During initial course development this summer, it was identified that MGL 2000 Business and Entrepreneurship Mindset has a very similar competency profile and competency statements to the existing Precision Ag course, ATG 2004 Principles of Business and Entrepreneurship.
- The BDA PCC discussed and reviewed the competency profiles, which led to the
 conclusion there is a close chance the competency profiles between the two courses
 possibly sharing up to 40% similarities, which is infringing upon Policy D21 (Course
 development, review and revision).
- The BDA PCC also discussed that replacing MGL 2000 with ATG 2004 in the BDA Program
 of Study would support a 2+2 pathway from the PAT program into the BDA program in that

- students coming from the PAT program would have an advantage of already completing a course in the BDA program of study.
- Making this program of study change at this point in the year is outside scheduling timelines, however, making this change for the 2024-2025 academic year provides a better student experience for the first cohort of BDA students currently entering into their second year of the program.
